- Rule of 20 – Guideline for Opening the bidding in 1st & 2nd seat

BANYAN LEARNING TREE SCHOOLS IN CAMBODIA

Patti Lee and Barbara Seagram escorted a group to Vietnam & Cambodia in 2011. Before they left, they had collected clothes, school supplies, and dental supplies to give to the children. They had also raised enough money to buy 40 bikes to give to children in landmine affected areas in Cambodia, so that the children could get to school. While in Cambodia, they visited the school near Phnom Penh and found that the school was one room with a cement floor and bamboo/tin sides. As well as bikes, they decided that *a proper school* was needed. Upon returning to Canada, they began fund raising and within a year, the school was built.

Barbara and Patti returned to Cambodia in March, 2012 for the opening of the school. Subsequently, their efforts have funded a library, installed electricity in another site, and furnished three other schools and libraries. There are now 4 schools in the Banyan Learning Tree system. Patti and Barbara have continued to do fund raising projects. They recognize that you cannot build and abandon. With that in mind, they are dedicated to maintaining the four schools, paying the teachers, and buying all of the supplies. The annual cost is \$20,000.

Patti & Barbara take turns going to Cambodia to check on all of the projects. The schools are centres for the communities. There are many outreach projects: a sewing centre, a weaving centre, and chicken farmer training. The libraries tend to have the only books available for the children in the villages.

Now, Barbara & Patti are working on ways to help the villagers with health care issues: many of these initiatives are case by case, but practical hygiene and preventative health measures are generally needed. More work is needed in this area, as many of these parents and children never see a doctor. Life expectancy in Cambodia is only 63 years. Many die in childhood of things that could easily be cured. Barbara & Patti are both passionate about all of these projects, and spend countless hours planning and running bridge events to raise the funds to support the projects.
